DO, SEE, GO

The Lake District has more than just
dramatic scenery to keep visitors busy.

BLACKWELL HOUSE

This Grade I-listed Arts and Crafts
home on the shores of Windermere plays
host to world-class exhibitions. Ceramics
by Turner Prize-winner Grayson Perry will
be on show from September 21.

HUTTON-IN-THE-FOREST

With part of the house dating back
to the 1300s, Hutton-in-the-Forest is
impressive, but it's the redesigned grounds
with their topiary-lined promenades that
really make it worth a visit.

GRIZEDALE SCULPTURE TRAIL

There are about 50 sculptures in Grizedale
Forest near Conistown Water. This summer
catch an exhibition of nine works by
members of the Royal Society of Sculptors
made in response to the rugged landscape.

GETTING THERE

New flights to Carlisle run twice daily
from London Southend (once on
Saturdays), and daily from Belfast City

CLEAR WINNER

Historically, accommodation in the
Lake District has been limited to
former great houses and pubs-with-
rooms, but the stylish Another Place,
The Lake, which launched on the banks
of Ullswater last year, is a welcome
alternative. Sister hotel to Watergate
Bay in Cornwall, it offers sailing,
paddleboarding and kayaking – not to
mention a glass-fronted pool (*below*)
and sauna. *Another.place/the-lake*



EXQUISITE FARE

When Simon Rogan's L'Enclume was awarded
its second Michelin star in 2013, it confirmed the
Lake District's status as a gastronomic destination
and paved the way for a host of other restaurants,
from Forest Side to The Samling. "The produce
here is like nowhere else in Britain," says Rogan.

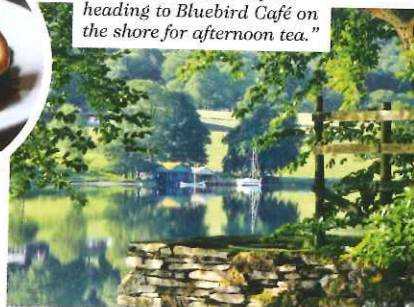
PRIVATE PITCH
